Dear Parents and Carers,

As detailed in today's letter from Mr Hunter-Whitehouse and Mrs Marshall, the Head at Callis Grange Infants, the schools are prapring for closure this Friday, 20th March. We know that a school closure can be difficult to parents, but we hope that we can work together at this difficult time for the safety of us all.

In order to prepare as best we can for this, please see below the procedures we will apply until further notice:

Communication

- A text and email will be sent home to you from the school, informing you of the school closure on Friday. Therefore it is <u>absolutely essential</u> that you are receiving text and email from school. If you think you are not, please check your details with the office as soon as possible.
- Following this, all future communications will be via email and updated on the school website.
- There will be no communications shared via our social media during this time, to avoid confusion and mixed messages.
- The school will also update parents of the closure on the school website, and the Kent County Council's website <u>www.kentclosures.co.uk</u>. Parents may also hear about the school closure by listening to KMFM, BBC Radio Kent and Heart FM.
- A text and email will be sent home to you from the school, informing you of the school re-opening.

Home Learning

- Prepared basic home learning packs will be sent home tomorrow (Thursday). These contain: writing
 pencils and colouring pencils, exercise books, reading book and your child's computer logins for
 Times tables Rock Stars and Purple Mash.
- There will be additional, more specific, home learning resources via the school website. These will be
 made available each Monday of term time and you will be alerted to these new weekly resources
 via email, once they have been uploaded.
- Please continue to use the online learning opportunities in place- Times Table Rockstars (maths),
 Purple Mash (literacy, maths, computer literacy), and additional sites such as BBC Bitesize please see Mrs Newport's additional handout tomorrow.

Free School Meals provision for pupils / Support for Vulnerable Families

AfterSchool Clubs, Breakfast Club and Extended Day bookings

- After School Clubs and wraparound care will run as normal until Friday 20th March at 6pm.
- All bookings for wraparound care from Monday 23rd March will be cancelled from the School Gateway system and monies will be held and put on to your next booking.
