- Click on Shared Blogs
- Find your class
- Simply add your comment by clicking the white cross on the green background

Any work/art/projects can also be uploaded onto the class notice boards. We'd love to see what you have been up to and look forward to hearing from you all.

I know that for many families this time has been made even more difficult by financial worries caused by businesses closing and work drying up. I know that school isn't actually open to provide the 'free school meals', but you may have heard that schools can issue shopping vouchers for £15 a week per child for those families who qualify. There have been some early glitches with the government system, but I think they are ironing them out as fast as they can. The application is fairly quick and relatively straightforward and well worth investigating.
