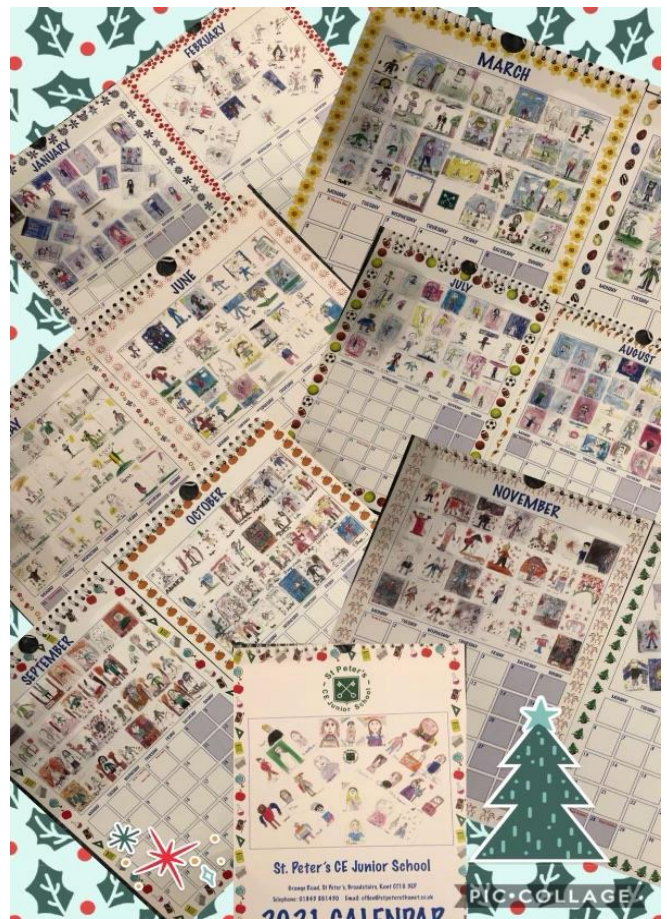
Extra copies to purchase!
