Swimming.	Ensure pupils are taught to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.	Supplement to provide additional lessons to year 6 pupils who do not meet the requirements and have missed almost two school years' worth of swimming lessons with lockdowns and national restrictions.	£500	Actual cost was approximately £3,000 for 12 weeks. Money was reallocated from other areas to cover this expense and extend swimming provision for year 6 who had missed much of their swimming lessons due to covid. At the end of the school year, 83% of the current year 6 were able to meet the required standard expected of them. Those who could not swim attended lessons weekly for terms 1 & 2 for extra lessons.
Emergency Fund	Pupils access safe, modern and appropriate equipment.
