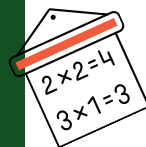

## Macsen's grizzly tale!

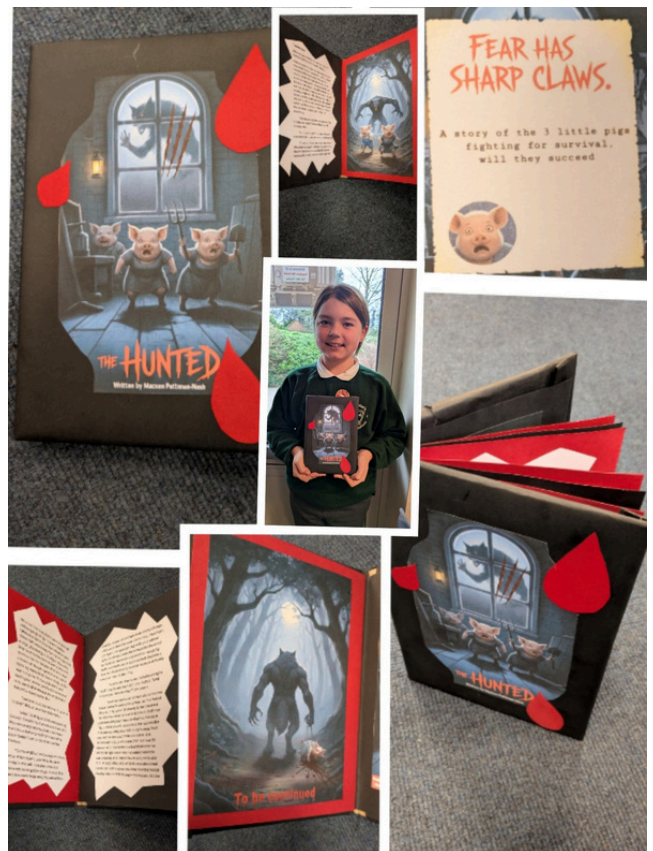

# Weekly Weather report!

As a part of our Geography fieldwork at St Peter's, each class will be reporting a comparison in the weather at St Peter's and a different location around the world.

Please find below the comparison location for each year group:

## Comparison location:

**Year 3** - St Peter's and different locations in the UK

**Year 4** - St Peter's and different locations in Europe

**Year 5** - St Peter's and different locations in Africa and Asia

**Year 6** - St Peter's and different locations in North America, South America and Antarctica

Monday: 3L	In St Peter's lightning has not been detected nearby for 14 days. However, in Padstow, Cornwall there were 25 lightning strikes recorded in the last 3 hours.
Wednesday: 3B	In St Peter's it was dry with highs of 10°C, whereas in Inverness there were light showers with highs of 9°C.
Friday: 3S	In St Peter's the UV index was 1.4, however in Mill Lane, Liverpool the UV index was 0.3.

Monday: 4B	In Broadstairs it is 14 degrees Celsius and sunny. In Verona in Italy, the weather conditions are very similar - it is also sunny and 13.7 degrees Celsius.
Tuesday: 4S	In Verona it was partly sunny with a temperature of 15 degrees Celsius and a minimum of 6C. In Broadstairs it was 10.3C.
Thursday: 4W	In Verona the highest recorded temperature was 11 degrees Celsius where the highest recorded temperature in Broadstairs was 13.3 degrees Celsius.

Monday: 5S	In Egypt today the highest temperature was 19 degrees Celsius and in Broadstairs we reached a temperature of 14.5 degrees Celsius.
Tuesday: 5L	In Egypt today, the average temperature was 22 degrees Celsius. The average temperature in Broadstairs was 9 degrees Celsius.
Thursday: 5BN	In St Peter's it was sunny with highs of 13°C and in Egypt it was 67°F, which is about 19 °C, and partly sunny.

Tuesday: 6I	We were surprised to discover that the air temperature in Broadstairs was 10 deg c BUT - was measuring 20.2 deg c in Antarctica!!!
Wednesday: 6WG	There were 0 lightning strikes in Broadstairs but 159 recorded at the weather station in Antarctica.
Friday: 6A	Yesterday our rain duration was 0 mins. Antarctica Rain duration was 92 mins!
