Our St Peter's Weekly Weather Report!

Using our incredible weather station, each week we are reporting a comparison in the weather at St Peter's and a different location around the world.

Year 3 - St Peter's and different locations in the UK

Monday: 3L	The sun will set 10 minutes later in Waterlooville, Hampshire than in St Peter's today.
Wednesday: 3B	In St Peter's the temperature is 12 degrees celsius, whereas the Glenballey valley weather station near Waterford, in Ireland, the temperature was 14 degrees celcius.
Friday: 3S	In St Peter's, the sun will set today at 6.06pm. But in Dundonald, Northern Ireland the sun will set at 6.36pm.

Year 4 - St Peter's and different locations in Europe

Monday: 4B	In Broadstairs today it is 11 degrees celsius with a chilly wind. In Verona, it is 19 degrees and partly cloudy.
Tuesday: 4S	In Broadstairs today it is 13 degrees celsius and partly cloudy. In Verona, it is 13.3 degrees.
Thursday: 4W	

Year 5 - St Peter's and different locations in Africa and Asia

Monday: 5S	In Broadstairs, the maximum wind speed reached 19.2 mph. We compared this to Uganda, where the wind speed reached 29.3 mph.
Tuesday: 5L	In Broadstairs, the maximum temperature reached up to 13.9 degrees celcius. In Egypt, the temperature reached up to 18 degrees celcius.
Thursday: 5BN	In Broadstairs, it has been 5 days since lightening was detected. We compared this with UAE and it was only 8 hours ago.

Year 6 - St Peter's and different locations in North America, South America and Antarctica

Tuesday: 6I	We noticed that in turns of brightness, Broadstairs is currently measuring 49,743 lux - whereas the Antarctic weather station recorded 92 lux. It must be strange having months of endless darkness.
Wednesday: 6WG	In Broadstairs we had 12 hours and 6 minutes of daylight today and in Antarctica they had 12 hours and 23 minutes. So we had a similar amount of daylight.
Friday: 6A	We have noticed a significant rise in the temperature over the last week, and there has been far less rain. 0% today!
