Well done to all of our footballers for representing the school with such enthusiasm and sportsmanship! ⚽

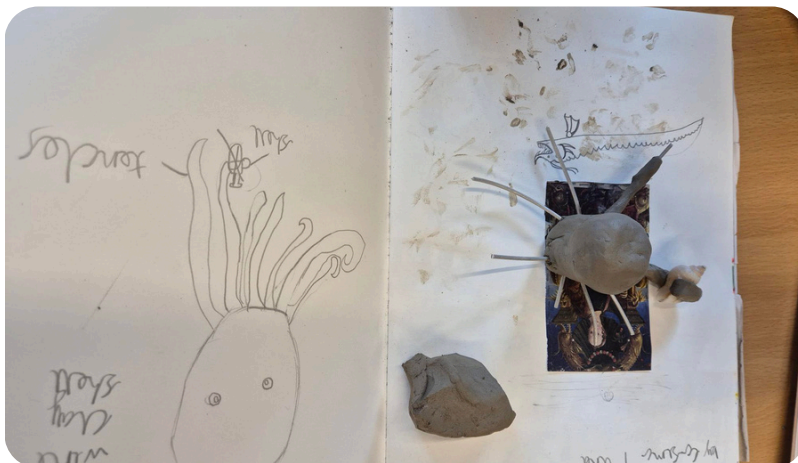
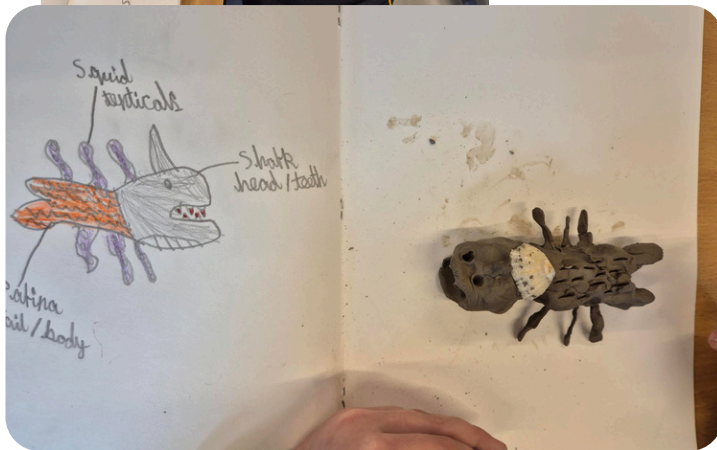
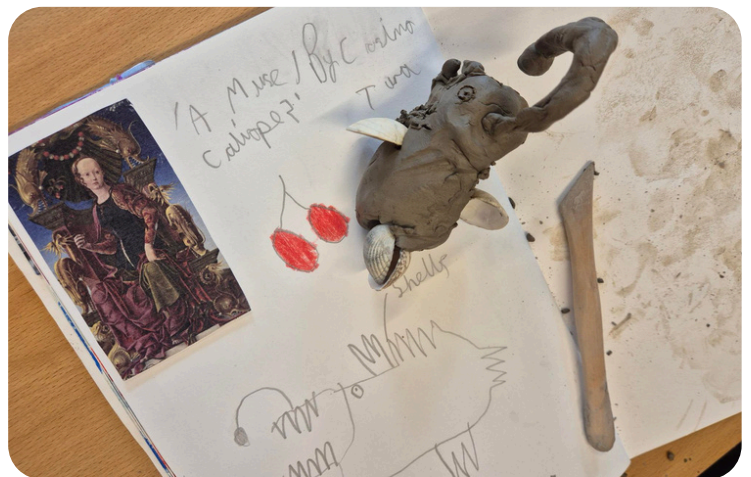


# Amazing artwork this term
