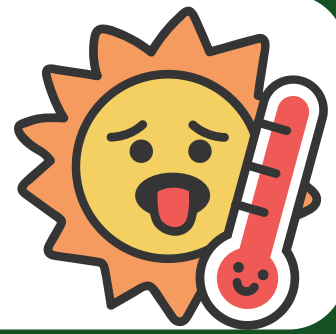

Our St Peter's Weekly Weather Report!

Using our incredible weather station, each week we are reporting a comparison in the weather at St Peter's and a different location around the world.

Year 3 - St Peter's and different locations in the UK

Monday: 3L	This week there is an amber weather warning in both St Peter's and the City of Westminster, London! The hottest day this week in St Peter's is predicted to be on Friday, which could reach up to 30°C. Whereas Wednesday is predicted to reach 35°C in the City of Westminster. It is going to be a hot one!!
Wednesday: 3B	Today there is an amber weather warning! Now, St Peter's not as hot as London and the surrounding area, but we have reached highs of 27°C.
Friday: 3S	Today there is a red weather warning of extreme heat in St Peter's with highs of 32 degrees. In central London, there is also a red warning with highs of 34!

Year 4 - St Peter's and different locations in Europe

Monday: 4B	The weather in Broadstairs feels warm today! It is 19 degrees celsius however there is a nice breeze. In Rome the temperature is 32 degrees but feels like 34! So it is a lot warmer than here!
Tuesday: 4S	In Sorrento it is 31C but the humidity is high. In Broadstairs it is 22 and warm!
Thursday: 4W	Today was much cooler than Bologna! they has a maxium temperature of 35.4 degrees celsius where as in Broadstairs it was only 23 degrees celsius

Year 5 - St Peter's and different locations in Africa and Asia

Monday: 5S	On Monday in Broadstairs , there were 0 lightening strikes. In Mombassa there were 2.
Tuesday: 5L	On Tuesday in Broadstairs, there were 381 lightening strikes.
Thursday: 5BN	On Friday in Broadstairs it was an average of 31 degrees. In Guam it was an average of 26 degrees.

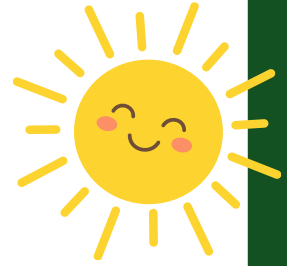
Year 6 - St Peter's and different locations in North America, South America and Antarctica

Tuesday: 6I	We did notice that on Tuesday this week we had 381 lightning strikes recorded by our weather station
Wednesday: 6WG	This week we looked at the weather in Gran Canaria the temperature was 26 degrees. In St Peters it was cooler at 23 degrees.
Friday: 6A	This morning's temperature in St Peters is already 27 degrees (at 9am). We are not looking forward to midday!
