# Our St Peter's Weekly Weather Report!

Using our incredible weather station, each week we are reporting a comparison in the weather at St Peter's and a different location around the world.

## Year 3 - St Peter's and different locations in the UK

Monday: 3L	Today, the highest temperature in St Peter's was 20.2°C. This is 13.2°C cooler than last Friday! Can you believe it was 33.4°C?!
Wednesday: 3B	It's a lovely, long bright day today in St Peter's. The sun rose at 4.42am and will set at 9.13pm!
Friday: 3S	As it is the summer time, the sunrise for us today was at 4.43am. But over in Wales, the sunrise was at 5.07am which is later than us!

## Year 4 - St Peter's and different locations in Europe

Monday: 4B	Today was much cooler in Broadstairs than it has been recently, there is a lovely breeze and the temperature is 19 degrees. In contrast, the temperature in Naples is 29 degrees and much warmer.
Tuesday: 4S	In Broadstairs the weather was sunny and warm, with temperatures of 22 degrees celsius. In Rome, the temperatures reached 38 degrees and the city was under an extreme heat warning.
Thursday: 4W	St Peter's was warm today but not as warm as Milan. Milan had a maximum temperature of 34.1 degrees celsius whereas St Peter's had a maximum temperature of 24.2 degrees celsius.

## Year 5 - St Peter's and different locations in Africa and Asia

Monday: 5S	On Monday In Broadstairs and India, the solar radiation was similar but the average temperature was very different. Broadstairs had an average of 18° and India had an average of 33.2°.
Tuesday: 5L	On Tuesday in Broadstairs, there was 57% humidity. In Nairobi, it was 32%!
Thursday: 5BN	On Thursday, in Broadstairs, the average temperature was 24.7 degrees Celsius, but it was slightly cooler in Nairobi at 23.2!

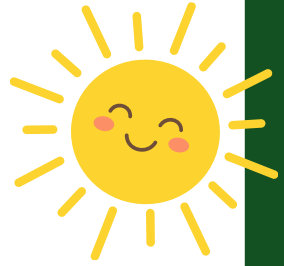
## Year 6 - St Peter's and different locations in North America, South America and Antarctica

Tuesday: 6I	As we start school today, the temperature in St Peters is 17 degrees; in Dallas where the next world cup game (Australia v Egypt) is being played later - the temperature in 26 degrees.
Wednesday: 6WG	Today's 18.5 degrees in St Peter's, the temperature in DR Congo is

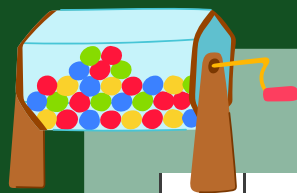
